Antifreeze

EXTREMELY DANGEROUS TO CATS

Every year many cats die because they have been poisoned by ethylene glycol - the main ingredient in most antifreeze.

What is antifreeze?

It is used in cars and occasionally in garden water features to prevent freezing.



Drinking just a tiny amount (or grooming it off fur or paws) will cause serious kidney damage and suffering, and often kills.

Protect your cat

- Avoid using antifreeze products where possible
- Choose products which use an alternative to ethylene glycol if possible
- Never put antifreeze in water which is accessible to animals
- Store safely away from animals and children
- Clean up any spillages thoroughly and immediately
