


Website





The five-week social media campaign starred two new ambassador cats, Domino and McTatters, who helped spread the message about the essential resources cats need to stay physically and mentally healthy.





Find evidence-based, pragmatic and sustainable solutions for cats

Our in-house experts are joined by a network of over 170 veterinarians and cat welfare professionals to provide practical and accessible educational resources, online courses, and other learning materials to all those working with or interested in helping cats.

- 37 feline behaviour experts on the Feline Wellbeing Panel
- 100 veterinarians making up the ISFM Academy of Feline Practitioners
- 8 lectures on cat welfare to international audiences
- 764 new course enrolments + 9% enrolments in 2022 from 40 countries

Our ongoing work to improve the welfare of unowned cats around the world continues to grow, with the creation and publication of **new educational resources and guidelines** – designed to provide practical assistance and support with the challenges experienced by those working on the frontline, such as in animal shelters and rehoming groups.





AAFP: ISFM partners with the **American Association of Feline Practitioners** in publishing the *Journal of Feline Medicine and Surgery* as well as use under licence of the Cat Friendly Practice programme in North and South America – which has led to the registration of over 600 additional Cat Friendly Practices.



ICAM: International Cat Care is part of the International Companion Animal Management Coalition (ICAM), collaborating on improving humane cat population management.



ACC&D: As part of the **Alliance for Contraception in Cats and Dogs**, International Cat Care contributes to the development of non-surgical solutions to population management.



FECAVA: International Cat Care is an associate member of the **Federation of European Companion Animal Veterinary Associations**.



WSAVA: ISFM is a member of the **World Small Animal Veterinary Association** and collaborated to organise a feline stream at WSAVA Congress.



EU Dog and CA alliance: International Cat Care is represented on the **Canine and Feline Sector Group** of the Animal Health and Welfare Board, England. The charity is also a member of the **EU Dog and Cat Alliance** and the **All-Party Parliamentary Group on Cats**.



The Cat Group: Organised by International Cat Care, **The Cat Group** is a collection of professional organisations dedicated to feline welfare through the development and promotion of policies and recommendations on the care and keeping of cats.



Cat-Kind: International Cat Care is a member of the **Cat-Kind** group, a number of charities working together to make four month neutering the 'norm' for pet cats through collaboration on research and coordination of activities.

Financial review 2022

During 2022, we saw the return of our in-person Congress which helped to increase our income to pre-Covid levels, growing total income 14% on 2021.

We received several legacies during 2022, which will have a significant impact on the welfare of cats internationally. We were very grateful for the funding that veterinarian Tony Welsh contributed to our work on developing effective and sustainable solutions to help people working with unowned cats internationally as part of the Tony Welsh Educational Fund.



In 2022, despite a small predicted loss from implementation of our strategy to invest in the development and growth of the charity, we have a good level of reserves to take us into our next 3 year strategy.
